Dear Friends,

I was also told on good authority that many of the Representatives in the Texas House won by approximately 100 votes. As Justice Wainwright said, that means each of us voting and getting a couple of friends, neighbors, and family members out to vote. Make calls for the candidates and to get out the vote. There are plenty of opportunities to do this. Drive someone to the polls and go back and get someone else. Talk up the importance of voting to people in your neighborhood and others with whom you have contact.

On a personal note, Gretchen and I use the same dog groomer. Gretchen asked her if she had voted, and she said she didn't know if she had the time. Well, Gretchen spoke to her about the importance of voting. When the groomer came to me, I asked her the same question. She laughed and said that her husband was going to vote and she'd be going with him—that she now knew of the importance. That's two more conservative votes. Some people just need to be reminded that their vote counts.

There are 200 ladies in ARW plus about 30 associate members. If we each get at least two people to vote, just think what an influence we can be. This election isn't over yet. Even if you have already voted, you must continue to work until Nov 3 gets here—the day after the election. As the young Wounded Warrior told the UT team when asked by Coach Brown what advice he had for the team, the Marine said, "Always empty the magazine," which means work your hardest to the end and then some.

Care Packages for the Troops: Christmas is a terrible time to be away from home, and our troops are very far away and in great danger every day. We have been asked to provide some things from home to the soldiers of FOB Blessing, Afghanistan. These infantry guys are **very far forward** and out on patrols most of the time. Let's let them know that we haven't forgotten them!

When & Where: Packing party on **Saturday, November 6th, 10:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m.** at Carol Lyle's house, 2477 Waymaker Way, Austin 78746. **YOU MAY DROP ITEMS OFF EARLY IF YOU CAN NOT COME TO THE PACKING PARTY.**

How You Can Help:

- 1) Cash or Check donations are appreciated—we will be glad to shop for you—or bring items to be donated to the October and November luncheons;
- 2) Ask local elementary schools to write thank you notes and Christmas letters to the troops, which will be included in each box; and
- 3) Join us for our packing party on Saturday, November 6th, location to be announced.

Care Package List from Chaplain Joey (FOB Blessing):

Rule #1: *Many smaller items are better than a few large items.* For example, a package of ten snack-sized bags of chips is better than a single family size bag of chips.

Rule #2: We are thankful for anything you send!

Most common needs:

- good wool sox
- 16 oz bullet thermoses
- fleece throws
- calendars, pocket notepads/retractable pens
- hand/foot warmers
- Soap, shampoo, toothpaste, deodorant, disposable razors, Q-Tips
- *Single-serving* drink mixes (Kool-Aid Singles, etc)
- Beef Jerky
- Snack Foods, Microwave Popcorn
- Tobacco products
- Coffee
- Air Fresheners (Plug-in or stick-up type only)
- Greeting cards (card stores will often give you the old ones they are throwing away if you tell them it is for deployed soldiers.)

Items commonly sent that we don't really need:

- Bug Spray, Sunscreen
- Baby wipes
- Feminine hygiene products
- Items for children – we cannot give them out
- Phone Cards
- Cleaning products
- Bulk anything—large items don't distribute well
- Any kind of food preparation item or food that requires cooking such as canned goods
- Conditioner
- Toothbrushes

Children's books: The soldiers recently started a program that allows soldiers to record themselves reading a book for their children and to send it home on a dvd. The soldiers would greatly appreciate your donation of popular children's books for this program. Do not worry about duplicating books; if they have more than one copy of a book, the soldier sends the book home along with the dvd.

Includes range fee, ammo (loaner handguns available for shooting test). Services include instruction, passport photos, and notary services. Upon course completion, applicant will have a TR100 (proof of passing written test and the shooting proficiency test), a passport photo, and three notarized affidavits. These items are sent to DPS. Online application and fingerprint arrangements are responsibility of applicant.
